
Introduction

Varied Interest programs offered through the Wheaton Park District include day, evening, weekend, camp, individual, parent-child, family, special events, parties and workshop opportunities in drawing, painting, music/instrument lessons, vocal groups, youth drama, youth dance, Irish dance, computer classes, horsemanship, volunteerism, babysitting, magic, technology, science, photography, ceramics/pottery, trips, teens, foreign language, fencing, crafts, and more.

Classes are held at the Community Center, Mary Lubko Center, Central Athletic Complex, Monroe Middle School, Memorial Park Band Shell, and Cooperative Park District Partnership facilities.

Many households consider Varied Interest programs as additional expenses. In difficult economic times, fewer families have money set aside for "additional expenses". It is our goal to continue to provide fun and education programs at an affordable price.

Varied Interest worked with one local high school in 2016 to provide a safe and fun environment for the Safe Celebration Event. St. Francis High School students enjoyed an evening of games, food, and entertainment at the Wheaton Park District Community Center in celebration of their Junior and Senior Prom.



Highlights of 2016

- Dance instructors have established a reliable following for their classes and have been actively brainstorming new ways to reduce cancelled class sections.
- The Wheaton Park District secured complimentary housing for the Missoula Children's Theatre staff for a fifth consecutive year, courtesy of Hampton Inn-Naperville. This donation is valued at approximately \$1,700.
- The 2016 Spring Dance Recital was successful with over 200 dancers participating, and over 600 spectators.
- Teen Service Series continues to co-op with the Glen Ellyn Park District offering trips such as: Ronald McDonald House, Feed My Starving Children, West Suburban Humane Society, and participation in both district's Halloween events.



- ➢ Post Proms chose an alternative location, with the exception of St. Francis High School in 2016. On April 16, 2016, WPD hosted over 200 students at the Community Center. Over 100 volunteers assist at the Safe Celebration event. Wheaton North and Wheaton/Warrenville South High Schools did request the option to return in 2017.
- Youth Tech Inc computer classes were added to the Summer Enrichment offerings.
- ➤ There are 6-8 new class offerings with Lisa Lombardi Coaching Inc. Classes include topics like: building self-esteem, science based programs, and other educational opportunities
- Lincoln Park Zoo Lights family trip ran for the fourth consecutive year with 21 participants, which is up from 2015.
- ➤ The Varied Interest area added Glitzy Girls programs in fall 2016.
- ➤ The Varied Interest area added paleontology programs with T-Rexplorers in fall 2016, starting with a Winter Break Camp that ran with 6 participants.
- The Dance team created the Dance Mentorship program to help encourage young dancers to pursue leadership, motiviation, and dedication. This program gives them the responsibility in assisting our dance instructors with a class of younger dancers throughout the Winter season and at the Spring Dance Recital.

Budget Explanations

Misc. Teens

- Zone Parties
- •fewer participants and parties resulting in -\$1,000
- Varied Interest program additions included:
- Glitzy Girls classes
- •Lisa Lombardi Coaching Inc classes
- •Teen trips/School Day Out trips
- •Less Teen Trips ran in 2016 resulting in -\$1,000

Pottery

- Pottery Parties were combined with the Pottery Class GL code for convenience
- •There were 11 Pottery Parties, resulting in 119 participants and \$1,790 in revenue
- •Supply and wages costs were up due to the increase in enrollment and to cover cost of summer camps adding the pottery program to their curriculum

Other

- •Contractual program, Youth Tech Inc was hugely successful resulting in over \$2,000 net revenue for Summer Enrichment
- Music increased time offerings on each day of Private Guitar lessons by 2 lessons
- Children's Playhouse enrollment dropped due to a lesser known play in Winter 2016 resulting in -\$2,000 revenue

^{***}Camp I Don't Know layout was changed, participants could register for individual weeks at a lower price instead of a 6 week session at an elevated price. This affected overall participation numbers, but not financial numbers.

Budget Explanations (cont)

Pottery class revenue increased due more pottery enrollment and party revenue being combined with class revenue.

Youth Dance increased wages due to the addition of staff meetings and trainings to prepare for upcoming changes to the program.

Lesser known title in winter 2016 resulted in a net revenue loss of \$2,322.56 for Children's Playhouse. Winter 2016 play title was "A Night at the Wax Museum: The Musical".

Music net revenue increase of \$4,245.97 due to increase in lesson options and longer running sessions.

Miscellaneous Teens net revenue dropped approximately \$1,000 due to less Zone Parties being booked in 2016. There were 28 parties in 2016 as opposed to 47 parties in 2015.

Ice skating participation increased resulting in a \$1,622.94 net revenue increase from 2015-2016.

Marketing


Program cancelation can be a common occurrence in park district programing. The marketing strategy used to help keep programs running is referred to as "Generational Marketing". Marketing initiatives are geared specifically for certain generation segment; one size, no longer fits everyone.






Marketing (cont)

<u>Landing Pages</u> on the Wheaton Park District website are being created to better serve the public with finding important information quickly. The Dance Landing Page was created in 2016, and is being utilized again in 2017 to assist parents with finding dance recital information, locations to purchase dance attire, and instructor biographies.



Future landing pages will include; theatre, teens, and varied interest. This will help notify patrons of play audition and performance dates, upcoming teen trips, and many of our varied interest options that are available to them. Theatre will be first, as we enter 2017.

<u>E-Blasts</u> are done to promote programs and events, and to encourage attendance and enrollment. Two of our biggest success stories in Varied Interest were with Children's Playhouse: Willy Wonka Jr. and Summer Enrichment classes. After the e-blasts went out, Children's Playhouse ticket sales increased by 525 tickets and Summer Enrichment enrollment went up by 51 participants!



- Improvement in parent-camp director communication by utilizing the camp email address



Looking Ahead to 2017

Misc Teens

- •Increase co-op opportunities by reaching out to other districts for Teen Service Series trips
- •Begin planning stages for creation of a Counselor in Training program
- •Conduct school visits to generate interest for upcoming trips and programs; begin early stages of a Focus Group/Leadership Team

New Programming

- •Continue to expand Varied Interest offerings in additions to Glitzy Girls, Lisa Lombardi Coaching Inc, and T-Rexplorers that were added in 2016
- •Obtain co-opping opportunities for programming run through other Park Districts . ie: Skateboard lessons through Glen Ellyn Park District
- •Expand on Creative Arts and Drama programming

Dance

- Repackaging and renaming existing dance classes
- •Addition of 1-2 new dance instructors to increase class offerings
- •Addition of private dance lessons option
- •Creation of evaluation process for dancers to advance to the next level of dance

Location of Programming

- Facility space can be an issue, so research has begun to utilize District space outside of the Community Center for Varied Interest Programming, as well as underutilized space within the Community Center
- A focus group will meet to discuss underutilized programming space at the Community Center, and how to repurpose it for programming needs

Marketing

- Cross-marketing and bundling programs
- •Children's Playhouse program logo has been created and fundraising will begin in March 2017
- Dance department logo has been created for participants to purchase t-shirts, dance shoe bags, sweatshirts, and more


