It is the intention of the Wheaton Park District, DBA DuPage County Historical Museum, hereafter, Park District, to create a non-exclusive Independent Contractor relationship with Play-Well TEKnologies, hereafter, VENDOR. This agreement shall not be construed as creating an employee/employer relationship or joint employment relationship between the parties.

- I. VENDOR acknowledges and agrees that VENDOR is not entitled to any benefits or protections afforded employees of the Wheaton Park District (Park District) or bound by any obligations of employees of the Park District. Contractor understands and fully agrees that VENDOR will not be covered under provisions of the unemployment compensation insurance of the Park District or the workers' compensation insurance of the Park District and that any injury or property damage on the job will be VENDOR's sole responsibility and not the Park District's. Also, it is understood that VENDOR is not protected as an employee or as a person acting as an agent or employee under the provisions of the general liability insurance of the Park District and therefore, VENDOR will be solely responsible for Contractor's own actions. The Park District will in no way defend VENDOR in matters of liability.
- II. It is the intention of the parties to create a non-exclusive independent contractor relationship. The VENDOR may engage in other business activities and provide similar services to other entities and businesses, provided such services do not create a conflict of interest or interfere with the performance of the services contemplated by this agreement.
- III. The VENDOR agrees not to hold him/herself out as an employee or joint employee of the Park District to members of the public.
- IV. VENDOR acknowledges and agrees that VENDOR is solely responsible to pay all applicable federal, state and local income and withholding tax obligations or contributions imposed by social security, unemployment insurance and worker's compensation insurance on behalf of VENDOR and those employees, if any, employed by VENDOR.
- V. Payment Terms will be Net 30
 - a. VENDOR may be asked to provide an invoice for services.
 - b. VENDOR will need to provide W9 to Park District and speak with Finance Department to be added to Park District payment database prior to date of service to receive payment in a timely manner.



- c. All Payments will come Net30 after event from Paymerang. ACH payments can be arranged by VENDOR after first payment from Paymerang comes through.
- d. The Park District will report payments to an individual of \$600 or more to the IRS on Form 1099-Misc. VENDOR will provide to the Park District a Social Security Number or Federal Employer Identification Number for any individual receiving payment.
- VI. The VENDOR shall at all times have sole control over the manner, means and methods of performing the work/services required by the contract according to his/her own independent judgment, and is solely responsible for the direction of his/her employees and agents. The VENDOR acknowledges and agrees that s/he will devote such times as is necessary to produce the contracted for results. The VENDOR represents and warrants that the VENDOR has the skills and knowledge necessary to perform the services in a safe, proper, efficient, thorough and satisfactory manner and understands the Park District is relying on such representation in contracting with the VENDOR for the services.
- VII.The VENDOR acknowledges and agrees that s/he is responsible for all expenses, including the provision of equipment and materials related to provision of the contracted for results, unless otherwise agreed to.
- VIII. The VENDOR acknowledges and agrees that s/he is solely responsible for his/her employees'/ agents' actions in performing the work/services.
- IX. The VENDOR agrees to provide and keep in force at all times during this Agreement, the following coverages: comprehensive general liability insurance including contractual liability coverage, with minimum limits of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence, and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) annual aggregate; property damage insurance; full Worker's Compensation Insurance equal to the statutory amount required by law; and employers liability insurance with limits of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000). All insurance carriers providing the coverage set forth herein shall have a rating of A:VII as assigned by A.M. Best & Co. and satisfactory to the Park District in its sole discretion. All certificates of insurance in connection herewith shall be furnished to the park district no later than seven (7) days prior to the commencement date of this agreement.
 - a. These insurance requirements may be waived by written agreement. In the event the Park District waives this requirement, the VENDOR must understand and agree that s/he remains an independent contractor and shall not be an employee of the Park District. As an independent contractor, and consistent with Section I above, the VENDOR shall not be entitled to any benefits or protection afforded employees of the Park District, irrespective as to whether or not the VENDOR elects to maintain general liability and/or worker's compensation insurance to protect VENDOR.
- X. IX. All insurance coverage provided by the VENDOR shall be primary coverage as to the Park District. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the Park District shall be excess of the VENDOR's insurance and shall not contribute with it.
- XI. The Park District, its officers, agents and employees are to be covered and named as additional insureds under the General Liability coverage and shall contain no special limitation on the scope of protection afforded to the additional insureds. The policy and/or coverage shall also contain a "contractual liability" clause.
- XII.Said insurance policies shall not be canceled or amended without 30 days prior written notice having been given to the Park District. Such cancellation shall be grounds for the Park District to immediately cancel this Agreement.
- XIII.To the extent permitted by law, VENDOR shall indemnify, save, defend and hold harmless the Wheaton Park District, including its officers, officials, agents, volunteers and employees (collectively "Wheaton Park District") from and against any and all liabilities, obligations,



claims, damages, penalties, wage and hour claims, cause of actions, costs and expenses (including reasonable attorney and paralegal fees) which the Wheaton Park District may become obligated by reason of any accident, bodily injury, or death of persons, civil or constitutional rights violation, or loss or damage to tangible property, or any claim made under the Fair Labor Standards Act or any other federal or state law arising out of any negligent or wrongful act or omission of VENDOR (or anyone acting on behalf of VENDOR) and directly or indirectly in connection with, or under, or as a result of this Agreement.

- XIV.VENDOR acknowledges and agrees that VENDOR will comply with all applicable laws, rules and regulations promulgated by any federal, state, county, municipal, park district or any other governmental unit or regulatory body or court. VENDOR shall further maintain all applicable licenses, certifications, and/or permits.
- XV. The Park District may terminate this contractual agreement in the event of contract breach or (when applicable) if the program did not meet the minimum number of participants.
- XVI.VENDOR represents and warrants that the VENDOR has the skills and knowledge necessary to perform the services in a safe, proper, efficient, thorough and satisfactory manner and understands the Park District is relying on such representation in contracting with the VENDOR for the services.
- XVII.Force Majeure-In the event that either party shall be delayed, hindered or prevented from the performance of any act required hereunder by reason of acts of God, strikes, lock-outs, labor disputes, inability to obtain labor or materials at reasonable cost, power failure, governmental laws or regulations, quarantine or shelter-in-place orders issued by a governmental authority, riots, insurrection, war, unusually severe weather conditions, or other reasons not the fault of such party, then the performance of such act shall be excused for the period of such delay and the period for the performance for such act shall be extended for a period equivalent to the period of such delay.
- XVIII.VENDOR agrees to submit to a criminal background check and that this Agreement is contingent upon successfully completing a criminal background check. VENDOR shall not assign any employee, subcontractor of other person on behalf of the VENDOR to this agreement without cross-referencing that person with the state of Illinois and federal sex offender registries.
- XIX. This VENDOR constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties pertaining to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements and understandings either or written of the Parties in connection therewith. No modifications of this Contract shall be effective unless made in writing, signed by both Parties and dates after the date hereof. This Contract is not-assignable by the VENDOR.
