SUMMARY:

In November 2023, a Funding and Reimbursement Agreement was approved for the Sensory Playground between the Wheaton Park District and the Play for All Playground and Garden Foundation. This agreement anticipated \$600,000 for the cost of the playground designed for 5-to 12-year-olds and a picnic shelter.

During the bid process for the playground surfacing, a cost was requested for replacing the engineered wood fiber under the existing swings with a unitary surface that would match what is being installed under the new playground equipment. The additional cost would exceed the \$600,000 currently identified in the agreement by \$18,786 and would use the \$30,540 contingency that was a part of the previous cost estimate. Increasing the reimbursement amount to \$650,000 would account for both the overage and include a \$31,214 contingency.

PREVIOUS COMMITTEE/BOARD ACTION:

- April 2014 Park Board approved phase one funding and reimbursement agreement for 2-5-year playground and central gathering area
- April 2019 Park Board approved phase two funding and reimbursement agreement for treehouse
- March 2020 Park Board approved first amendment to the April 2019 agreement
- May 2021 Park Board authorizes purchase of a Gravity Rail with documentation that the foundation secured sufficient resources for reimbursement
- July 2021 Park Board authorizes purchase of a Net Climber with documentation that the foundation secured sufficient resources for reimbursement
- September 2021 Funding and reimbursement agreement for the gravity rail and net climber approved.
- November 2023 Funding and reimbursement agreement for the 5-12 year old playground equipment and picnic shelter approved.

REVENUE OR FUNDING IMPLICATIONS:

The Play for All Foundation would need to approve this amendment as well to increase the reimbursement amount to \$650,000.

SUMMARY:

As a part of the planned Play For All 5-12 year old playground construction, playground safety surfacing must be installed. Additionally, staff requested pricing to convert the swing area that is currently engineered wood fiber to a unitary surface. Staff continue to recommend unitary surfacing for consistency of safety and accessibility. Our bid specifications are written to allow for a variety of surfacing types that will meet the current standards for fall protection and accessibility.

Plans and specifications were prepared by staff and sent to 20 contractors. Bids were solicited on May 9, 2024 and they were opened on May 23, 2024. The results were as follows with recommended action highlighted:

^{*}Extended warranty was priced for both areas. \$12,661.79 is the portion for the 5-12 play area based on area compared to swings per contractor.

While we are disappointed at receiving pricing from only one contractor, based on a review of recent prior playground surfacing bid results, we are confident that this is a reasonable price. One of the potential bidders communicated to us that they have not been able to compete with the pricing from this company as a reason for not bidding.

Perfect Turf is the lowest responsive bid for materials and installation. Lab tests were provided to demonstrate the surface meets specifications. Perfect Turf has successfully completed a number of projects for the district in the past.

Alternate #1 requested an additional cost for a ten-year extended warranty. This is recommended to ensure the surface lasts at least half the expected life cycle of the playground equipment. (**This is done to create a level basis of bid as terms of company warranties can vary).

PREVIOUS COMMITTEE/BOARD ACTION:

A Funding and Reimbursement Agreement for Equipment Purchase for the Sensory Playground Between the Wheaton Park District and the Play for All Playground and Garden Foundation in the amount of \$600,000 was approved at the November 27, 2023 board meeting.

REVENUE OR FUNDING IMPLICATIONS:

\$500,000 is budgeted in the FY 2024 budget for this project and the balance will be budgeted in FY 2025 as this project will begin in Fall of 2024 and be completed in Spring of 2025. Regardless, the Play For All Foundation will be reimbursing the park district for related project costs up to \$600,000.

It is recommended that the Wheaton Park District Board of Commissioners approve a contract for the provision and installation of the Play For All Park Playground poured in place surfacing for the 5-12 play area at a cost of \$112,228, and a ten year warranty at a cost of \$12,661.79 from Perfect Turf LLC for a total amount of \$124,889.79.

WHEREAS, Play For All Playground and Garden Foundation ("Play for All") and the Wheaton Park District ("Park District) are parties to an agreement entitled "Funding and Reimbursement Agreement for the Purchase and Installation of an Additional Playground and Picnic Shelter for the Sensory Garden and Playground Between the Wheaton Park District and Play For All Playground and Garden Foundation made and entered into on November 29, 2023" ("Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, Play for All and the Park District wish to amend the Agreement to modify the Construction Fee, as that term is defined in Section 1 of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, Play for All and the Park District have determined that it is in their respective best interests to amend the Agreement on the terms and subject to the conditions set forth in the "First Amendment to Funding and Reimbursement Agreement for the Purchase and Installation of an Additional Playground and Picnic Shelter Between the Wheaton Park District and Play For All Playground and Garden" ("Amendment").

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Board of Park Commissioners of the Wheaton Park District, DuPage County, Illinois as follows:

- 1. The foregoing preambles to this Ordinance are hereby determined to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated in and made part of this Ordinance.
- 2. The form, terms and provisions of the proposed Amendment as presented to the Park District's Board of Park Commissioners ("Park Board") at this meeting are hereby in all respects approved as provided herein.
- 3. The President and Secretary of the Park Board, or his or her designee, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Amendment, in the name and on behalf of the Park District, and to take all such other actions and steps and execute all such further documents as said President and Secretary, or his or her designee, deem necessary or appropriate to carry out the terms and conditions of the Amendment and to effectuate its purpose.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO A FUNDING AND REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT FOR THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF AN ADDITIONAL PLAYGROUND AND PICNIC SHELTER FOR THE SENSORY GARDEN AND PLAYGROUND BETWEEN THE WHEATON PARK DISTRICT AND PLAY FOR ALL PLAYGROUND AND GARDEN FOUNDATION

This First Amendment ("Amendment") is made and entered into this 17th day of July, 2024, by and between Play For All Playground and Garden, an Illinois not-for-profit corporation ("Play for All") and the Wheaton Park District, an Illinois park district and unit of local government ("Park District"), and amends, in certain respects, that certain Funding and Reimbursement Agreement for the Purchase and Installation of an Additional Playground and Picnic Shelter for the Sensory Garden and Playground Between the Wheaton Park District and Play For All Playground and Garden Foundation made and entered into on November 29, 2023 ("Agreement"). Capitalized terms used but not otherwise defined herein shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Agreement.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Play for All and Park District are Parties to an Agreement regarding the financing, purchase and installation of an additional playground and picnic shelter to be located on certain property that the Park District currently leases from the DuPage County Forest Preserve District; and

WHEREAS, Play for All and Park District wish to amend the Agreement to modify the Construction Fee set forth in Section 1 of the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, District and Park District have determined that it is in their respective best interests to amend the Agreement on the terms and subject to the conditions set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, and intending to be legally bound hereby, the Parties agree to the following:

- 1. <u>Incorporation of Recitals</u>. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth in this Section 1.
- 2. <u>Funding</u>. The first sentence of Section 1 of the Agreement, entitled "FUNDING" is stricken and replaced with the following:

Play for All hereby agrees to pay or reimburse the Park District the sum of Six Hundred and Fifty dollars (\$650,000), which constitutes the full cost of all materials required to construct the Project (the "Construction Fee"), according to the funding procedure outlined in Section 1 and 2 of this Agreement.

3. <u>Counterparts.</u> This Amendment may be executed in counterparts, each of which shall be an original but all of which taken together shall constitute but one and the same instrument. In the event any signature is delivered by facsimile or by e-mail delivery of a scanned .pdf file, such signature shall create a valid and binding obligation of the party with the same force and effect as if the facsimile or scanned .pdf signature page were an original thereof.

5. <u>Entire Agreement; Modification</u>. All other terms and conditions contained in the Agreement remain unchanged. The Agreement and this Amendment contain all of the terms and conditions agreed on by the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and no other alleged communications or agreements between the Parties, written or otherwise, shall vary the terms hereof. Any modification of the Agreement or this Amendment must be in writing and signed by all Parties.

SUMMARY:

During construction, the contractor encountered unexpected water, rock, and sand underground, resulting in additional excavation, framing, and concrete pouring. Staff also observed these conditions during construction. The contractor provided the attached documentation of these conditions and submitted a request for change in the amount of \$5,183.94 to account for labor and materials. They identified the additional machine time but did not request payment for this.

PREVIOUS COMMITTEE/BOARD ACTION:

A contract with Utility Dynamics in the amount of \$71,100 was approved at the February 21, 2024 Board meeting.

REVENUE OR FUNDING IMPLICATIONS:

The Board approved a \$7,100 (10%) contingency at the time the contract was approved.



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Central Sports Lighting Extra Day Charges Due to Site Conditions



Hi Steve.

Please see the attached breakdown for the extra day we had preparing the holes for concrete.

Due to the unexpected water, rock, and sand underground, our work digging, framing, and pouring took longer than we had budgeted in our bid. We also used far more concrete than we expected. The amount of concrete that Musco calculated in their documents was 2.4 cubic yards per foundation, where we used 9 yards total for two foundations. At 3' depth, the hole had collapsed due to the ground water, and we had to backfill with concrete. The collapse was 3' wider than the hole we had dug for the foundation and extended down for 4'.

UDC feels that these conditions were not evident during the bidding process and that our work is reimbursable due to unforeseen site conditions.







Earlier this year we requested approval to order three trucks through the cooperative state purchasing contract. One of these trucks was intended for replacement of truck #1112, a 2014 Crew Cab/Dump Truck.

Recently another one of our trucks (#1103) had a valve spring fail which resulted in damage to the engine cylinder that would require replacement of the engine at a cost of nearly \$11,000. This truck is similar to truck #1112 and was scheduled for replacement in 2026.

Since truck #1112 is still running, rather than disposing it when we receive the replacement, we are recommending to dispose of truck #1103 in its current condition and move it's replacement schedule up to 2025.
