


I am going to a Summer Saturday at the Sensory Garden Playground in Lisle.

I can play on the playground with my family and friends!




If I need help expressing what I want, there are visual support signs I can use to help me communicate!

Some children have difficulty with verbal communication and may use **visual supports**. This picture board helps reduce anxiety by allowing individuals to communicate by pointing to a picture.
